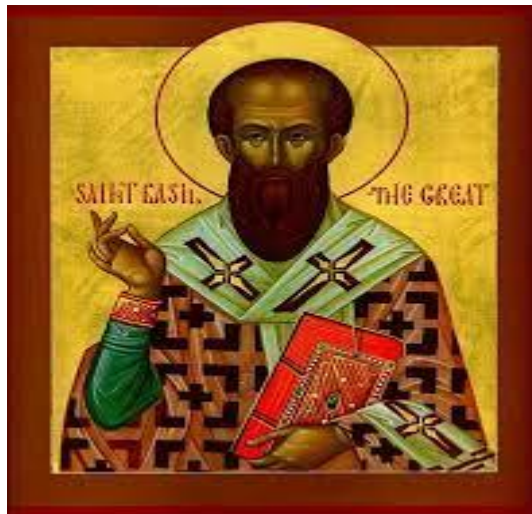


- So the children on our school searched,found and shared some information about their lives and then made some painting!

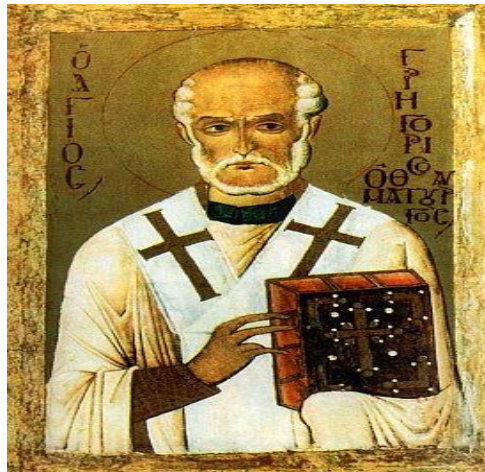
- The **Three Hierarchs** of Eastern Christianity refers to Basil the Great (also known as Basil of Caesarea), Gregory the Theologian (also known as Gregory of Nazianzus) and John Chrysostom.

St. Basil

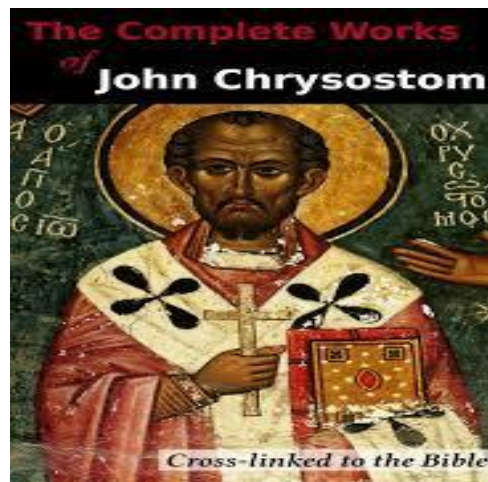
- St. Basil the Great St. Basil came from a family of saints. He built monasteries and hospitals and took care of poor children. He even wrote a liturgy that we use ten times .



- St. Gregory the Theologian St. Gregory understood God's words and tried to explain them to people. He studied the Holy Scriptures and wrote about the Holy Trinity. He was a thinker who shared his love of God



- St. John Chrysostom St. John was a famous speaker and they called him “golden-mouthed”. He showed us how to live God’s way in our every day lives. He also wrote the Divine Liturgy that we celebrate most of the time



- The Three Hierarchs were among the greatest teachers in the church. They tried to lead people to worship God. They were Bishops and were later called the luminaries of the Church. They considered to be the protectors of knowledge and education(therefore of teachers and students).Thus the 30th of January is dedicated to their celebration and remembrance.

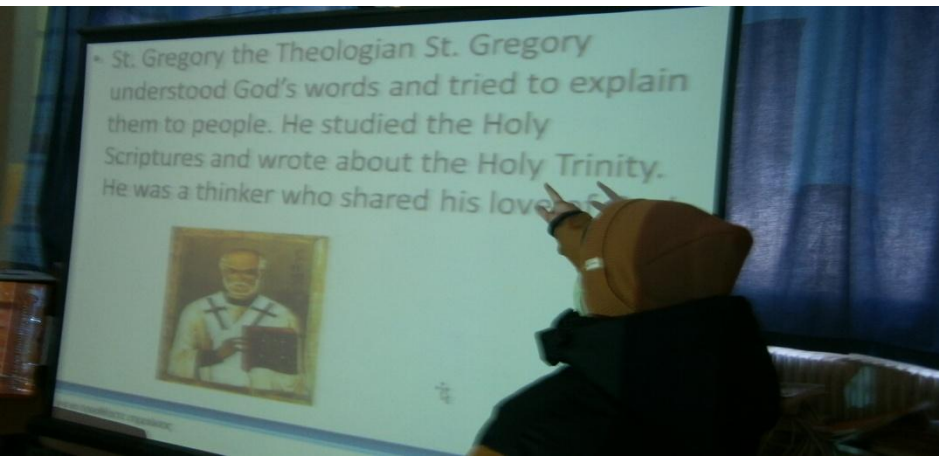

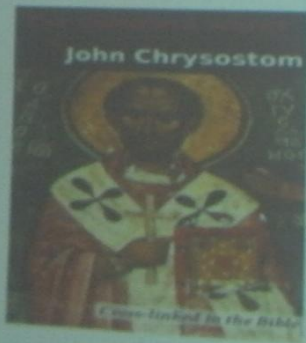
